Stages	Procedure	Time
Objectives	To practice a. previewing and predicting b. scanning for information	
Warmer	 Teacher asks students a. what they would do if one day they woke up and they found that their phone or computer had been blocked. Teacher elicits response from one or two students on a. cyberattacks and cyber security. 	4 mins
Pre-reading	 Teacher writes the title on the board. Teacher asks students to preview the title and pictures on pages 28 to 31. Teacher asks a few students what they know about the topic and what they expect to read in the text. Teacher writes their predictions on the board. 	2 mins
While-Reading	 Teacher distributes Task 1. While reading, students scan the text for information as they read. 	8 mins
Post-reading	 Teacher checks answers. Teacher distributes Task 2 and students work on Task 2. Teacher distributes Task 3. In pairs, students rearrange the sequence in Task 3. 	20 mins
Wrap	 Teacher checks predictions. In small groups, students discuss on what else people can do to protect themselves from cyberattacks. Teacher monitors the students' discussions. 	6 mins





Task 2

- 1. Ransomware is a cyberattack on computer users.
- The virus is installed when users are tricked into clicking a web link to watch a video. When users are asked for permission to play the video, the virus installs itself in their computer.
- 3. The virus activates after a few days and takes over the victim's computer by locking it.
- They feel scared because they believe that they might be fined thousands of dollars or sent to jail for downloading illegal software, movies, images or music.
- 5. It is called ransomware because users are asked for a ransom disguised as a fee or fine.
