Stages	Procedure	Time
Objectives	 To practice a. skimming and scanning skills b. vocabulary in context – identifying synonyms c. determining structure of text/story 	
Warmer	 Teacher starts by showing a picture of the arowana fish and asks students: Do you recognize this fish? What is it called? What do you know about this fish?	3 mins
Pre-reading	 Teacher gives students 3 mins to skim through the passage. Teacher distributes Task 1 In small groups, students work on Task 1 to reorder the sentences to form the story. 	12 mins
While-Reading	 Teacher gets different students to read paragraphs of the story out loud. Students check their answers to Task 1 in the meantime. Teacher gives final confirmation of the correct order. 	10 mins
Post-reading	 Teacher distributes Task 2. In pairs, students discuss answers. Teacher elicits and discusses the answers. Teacher distributes Task 3. Students do task individually. Teacher elicits for answers. 	12 mins
Wrap	Teacher does a concept check of the lesson	3 mins
