Objectives	 To practice a. guessing the meaning in context b. scanning skills 	
Warmer	 Teacher asks students a. What government departments do you know? b. Which government department is doing a good job? Teacher leads into the topic of the day. 	3 mins
Pre-reading	 Teacher arranges the students into small groups. Teacher distributes Task 1. In small groups, students work on Task 1a. Teacher checks answer. Teacher asks students to discuss and complete Task 1b. Teacher checks the answers. 	10 mins
While-Reading	 Teacher arranges the students into pairs. Teacher distributes Task 2. Teacher asks students to use scanning skills to extract specific information. In pairs, students discuss and complete Task 2. Teacher checks the answers and provide feedback. 	15 mins
Post-reading	 Teacher distributes Task 3. In pairs, students complete Task 3. Teacher discusses the answers. 	8 mins
Wrap	 Teacher does a concept check of the lesson by asking What new government departments does Malaysia need? What would their jobs be? 	4 mins
